1. Welcome and Consent Agenda [00:00:07]

At 1:37pm, Council Chair Mayor Dawn Ramsey welcomed the Wasatch Front Regional Council members and guests. Introductions were made around the table, and online via roll call. [00:04:42] Mayor Ben Nadolski was welcomed as a new member to the Council and he introduced himself.

[00:05:43] ACTION: Mayor Ramsey brought attention to the first item on the agenda - the minutes of the October 26, 2023 meeting and Financial statements and check registers for September, October, and November 2023 and Budget/Expenditure Report to date. Commissioner Bob Stevenson made a motion to approve all the documents as presented and Councilmember Dan Dugan seconded the motion. The minutes and financial statements were approved unanimously.

2. Chair Report [00:06:36]

a. ACTION: Endorse appointments to WFRC Council and Committees

Mayor Ramsey, as the WFRC Chair, presented the appointments of WFRC Members to the Regional Growth Committee (RGC), Transportation Coordinating Committee (Trans Com), WFRC Budget Committee, Active Transportation Committee (ATC), Wasatch Front Economic Development District (WFEDD) and Joint Policy Advisory Committee (JPAC). Appointments to WFRC and its Committees are also made by the County Councils of Governments (COGs) and other appointing authorities that partner with WFRC. **ACTION:** [00:09:30] Mayor Jeff Silvestrini made a motion that the members of the Council endorse the appointments to WFRC Council and other Committees as listed. Commissioner Jim Harvey seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous in the affirmative.

b. Legislative session report and endorse positions on legislation [00:11:20]

Mayor Ramsey introduced Miranda Jones Cox, WFRC, who explained the legislation that is pertinent to the region. WFRC members can keep themselves apprised of notable legislation by subscribing to WFRC's <u>Government Affairs</u> emails which are frequently distributed during the session. 4. Transportation Coordinating Committee (Trans Com) [00:41:31]

Mayor Mark Shepherd, Trans Com Chair, introduced Ben Wuthrich, WFRC, who discussed modifications requested for the TIP.

a. Board Modifications to the 2024-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Wuthrich stated that since the last meeting of the Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC), WFRC received requests to modify the current 2024-2029 TIP. The modification required action from Trans Com (since WFRC was not meeting) and the Utah Transportation Commission but did not require a new air quality conformity analysis or a 30-day public comment period. The modification is attached to the approved resolution.

b. ACTION: Board Modifications to the 2024-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) [00:43:30] Mr Wuthrich continued his report by briefly describing the modification requests to the current 2024-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), that have been received since the last meeting of Wasatch Front Regional Council. [01:04:48] ACTION: Mayor Shepherd made a motion to approve the modifications as discussed. Mayor Jeff Silvestrini seconded the motion and the affirmative vote was unanimous in the affirmative.

5. Regional Growth Committee (RGC) [01:05:16]

a. Station Area Plan Certification Request: 13 Stations in downtown Salt Lake City

Mayor Ramsey directed the meeting to Mayor Bob Dandoy, Chair of RGC, for an update on RGC. Mayor Dandoy stated that there were important guiding principles and goals discussed in the RGC meeting held last week that will assist us in planning for the future of our region. Mayor Dandoy then introduced Megan Townsend, the Community and Economic Development Director at WFRC. Ms. Townsend gave an overview of the Station Area Plan Technical Assistance that is available, as well

as the requirements under House Bill 462 from 2022. She then explained that downtown Salt Lake City is looking to certify 13 stations:

Nick Norris, Salt Lake City Planner Director, highlighted key points for the 13 stations and explained that the goal is to have the work done by the 2034 Winter Olympics, which are slated to be coming to Utah. **[01:24:19]** Mayor Jeff Silvestrini made a motion to recommend the 13 downtown Salt Lake City Station Areas to the Wasatch Front Regional Council for certification. Mayor Brandon Stanger seconded the motion. There was no further discussion, and the motion passed unanimously.

6. <u>Reports [01:26:43]</u>

Mayor Ramsey invited Bryce Bird, with the Utah Division of Air Quality, to review current ozone level findings.

a. Potential Impacts of Federal Ozone Air Quality Standards

Utah is currently not able to meet requirements of the Federal Clean Air Act related to ozone levels. These requirements are extremely difficult to meet because of high levels of "background" ozone, which comes from outside Utah or from natural sources. This situation poses potential risks for significant highway and transit capacity-increasing projects to proceed. WFRC staff, in collaboration with Mr. Bird, briefed the Council on this issue and discussed ongoing collaborative efforts to address the situation. Materials that can help leaders inform their communities will be sent as follow up to this discussion.

b. Executive Director's Report [01:51:45]

Mayor Ramsey turned the time to Andrew Gruber, WFRC, who introduced four new staff members of WFRC staff. Nate Currey, Communications Manager; Madison Aviles, Local Administrative Advisor, and Tim Watkins and Matt Ryan, both planners in the Community and Economic Development group.

Mayor Ramsey stated that the next Council meeting will be held on March 28, 2024, and pointed out the upcoming events on the bottom of the meeting agenda. With no further business, Mayor Ramsey stated that since Utah State law requires that elected officials serving on committees such as those of the Wasatch Front Regional Council receive training regarding the Utah Open and Public Meetings Act, an 8-minute video would now be shown in order to comply with this requirement. **ACTION: [01:58:38]** Mayor Ramsey asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting upon completion of the training video. Councilmember Aimee Winder Newton made a motion to adjourn upon the conclusion of the video, and Commissioner Jim Harvey seconded. The affirmative vote was unanimous. The meeting adjourned at 3:43pm.

Notes to the Council Budget Reports

February 2024

The Council Budget report reflects the period of July 1, 2023 - January 31, 2024, which represents 58% of the fiscal year. Overall, 34% of the total amount budgeted for the year has been expended through the end of January. The relevant budget column in this report is the revised budget adopted by the Council in October 2023.

The information contained in this report shows expenditures by categories as line-items, and allows the Council and staff to analyze progress and address any areas of concern. It is not unusual for some variation in percentage of budget used, specifically for those expenses such as audit fees, software licenses, dues and insurance, which are primarily paid near the beginning of each fiscal year. When WFRC and its partners initiate new joint projects midway through the fiscal year, the revenue lines reflect additional partner payments.

The Council Budget by Program report shows expenditures by program, and reflects anticipated progress through the fiscal year. Two programs are closer to completion for FY24: consulting work on the CEDS early in the year is reflected in the WFEDD total, and the Household Travel Survey is wrapping up with final invoices in the next few months. Variances in the rate of expenditure by program are considered normal and include some programs that are expected to carry forward into the next fiscal year.

At the Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC) meeting, the Council will hear an update on transportation and growth-related outcomes from the 2024 Legislative General Session.

BACKGROUND:

It was another successful year for growth-related issues in the 2024 General Legislative session, with collaborative and innovative approaches to address some of Utah's growth challenges, to maintain and enhance quality of life in Utah for generations to come.

The Legislature continues to prioritize multimodal transportation funding with another year of significant investment. Consistent with <u>Utah's Unified Transportation Plan</u>, significant additional funding was appropriated to invest in providing transportation choices for Utahns, including \$775M one-time and \$330M ongoing to the state Transportation Investment Fund, providing new ongoing funding for the Transit Transportation Investment Fund, and authorizing funding for local transportation projects. This builds on the investments authorized in last year's session, including the historic investment of \$45M ongoing to the Active Transportation Investment Fund (for the Utah Trail Network).

The Governor and Legislature also took a "partnership, not preemption" approach for housing, as recommended by our partners at the Utah League of Cities and Towns. The legislature's approach this session was to provide tools to local governments to help address the housing challenges seen in their communities.

WFRC staff prepared this detailed 2024 Legislative Session Wrap Up.

The intersection of SR-190 and Fort Union Boulevard is at the mouth of Big Cottonwood Canyon (BCC). This intersection sees significant traffic congestion and queuing from traffic heading southbound to go eastbound up Big Cottonwood Canyon. This project will widen SR-190 to two lanes eastbound for 1/2 mile up BCC, and will construct intersection modifications which include dual SB left turns and bike lane improvements. The SB left turn movement is the major source of congestion at the mouth of the canyon, and adding another turn lane will improve safety and reliability while reducing congestion. The scope of this project is to replace the bridge carrying 5600 South over the Jordan and Salt Lake Canal in Holladay City (035131D). During design it was determined that there would be impacts to several utilities in the vicinity of the bridge, increasing the overall replacement cost. The contracts managing the Express Lanes will end in 2027. Procuring, testing and accepting new systems takes several years to perform. UDOT needs to prepare procurement contracts now so that the new contracts and systems will seamlessly transition in 2027. The project was initially funded with federal community impact funds only, knowing that additional local funds needed to be added to complete the scope of this segment of the project.

BACKGROUND:

Over the past several months, WFRC staff and a consultant team have been leading a collaborative effort to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for all roadway users in the WFRC region. An analysis of safety needs was completed last fall, which included crash history, roadway risk factors, and input from communities throughout Weber, Davis, Salt Lake, Tooele, Morgan, and southern Box Elder counties. Strategies and project types to address these safety needs have recently been shared and discussed with communities at a series of 12 geographic focus area meetings. The needs analysis and recommended strategies, along with other elements of this planning effort are being documented in the <u>draft Comprehensive Safety Action Plan</u>.

One of the primary purposes of the Action Plan is to make communities in the WFRC region eligible to apply for the federal Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary grant program. It will be up to each local government to decide whether to apply for funding through SS4A to implement safety strategies and project types referenced in the Action Plan. The timelines associated with this program in 2024 have been accelerated and in order for local governments to apply for funding this spring, the Action Plan must be adopted by April 30. The consultant team has accelerated Plan development, and WFRC staff recommends that the WFRC Council delegate to Trans Com the authority to adopt the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP) at their April 25 meeting. This would allow adequate time for review of the Plan before adoption. Trans Com has received several updates regarding the development of the CSAP in prior meetings.

Additionally, as part of the Action Plan, a resolution has been prepared for the Regional Council to establish a goal to work towards zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries. This resolution will affirm WFRC's commitment to improving roadway safety. Trans Com reviewed and unanimously recommended the adoption of this safety resolution in connection with their February 15 meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

Trans Com and WFRC staff recommend that the Council make a motion "to adopt the resolution to work towards zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries, and delegate to Trans Com the authority to adopt the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan."

RESOLUTION OF THE WASATCH FRONT REGIONAL COUNCIL ESTABLISHING THE GOAL TO WORK TOWARDS ZERO ROADWAY FATALITIES AND SERIOUS INJURIES

WHEREAS the Wasatch Front Regional Council is the officially designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Salt Lake and Ogden-Layton Urban Areas; and

WHEREAS between 2018 and 2022, in the Wasatch Front Regional Council planning area, 619 people died and another 3,247 people were seriously injured due to roadway crashes; and

WHEREAS crashes that result in death or serious injury are largely preventable, and the Wasatch Front Regional Council acknowledges that the only acceptable goal is to eliminate deaths and serious injuries to all roadway users; and

WHEREAS having safe, user-friendly streets is one of the goals of the adopted 2023-2050 Wasatch Front Regional Council Regional Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS creating safe, user-friendly streets will encourage active transportation, improving population health, air quality, and overall public well-being; and

WHEREAS the Wasatch Front Regional Council's Comprehensive Safety Action Plan presents the region's commitment and strategies to reducing deaths and serious injuries to all roadway users.

NOW, THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED, by the Wasatch Front Regional Council:

- 1. Wasatch Front Regional Council supports proactively utilizing a "Safe System Approach" to improve safety for all roadway users, rather than relying on a reactive approach to address roadway fatalities or serious injuries, and
- 2. Wasatch Front Regional Council declares that any roadway fatality or serious injury is unacceptable and supports reasonable measures to prevent roadway crashes, and
- 3. Wasatch Front Regional Council establishes a goal of reducing deaths and serious injuries for all roadway users by 50% by the year 2040, and
- 4. Wasatch Front Regional Council establishes a goal of reducing roadway fatalities and serious injuries by 2.5% each year compared to the preceding three-year rolling average, and
- 5. Wasatch Front Regional Council will measure the progress towards these regional goals and will provide regional quantitative metrics that are reported annually.

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), the most recent federal transportation authorization bill approved November 2021, requires all metropolitan planning organizations (MPO), state transportation departments, and public transportation operators to cooperate in preparing a report of federal funds obligated during the immediately preceding year. The WFRC staff, with the help of UDOT and UTA, has prepared a report of obligated federal, and local and state match funding during federal fiscal year 2023 (October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2023). For the State of Utah, these federal funds currently represent about twenty percent of the total highway and transit revenues.

At the March 28th Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC) meeting, the WFRC staff will outline proposed modifications and clarifications to the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) amendment process. In summary, WFRC staff and the Regional Growth Committee (RGC) recommend these four clarifications:

- 1. Inclusion of amendments that only modify a project's needs-based phase (the timing of anticipated need independent of anticipated funding).
- 2. Clarification that Level 1 amendments (the least complex modifications), which are subject to the approval by the WFRC Executive Director, require consultation with affected communities and/or transportation agencies, the Federal Highway Administration, the Interagency Consultation Team, and the Regional Growth Committee (RGC) Chair and Vice-Chair.
- 3. Clarification that for Level 2 amendments, the existing regional emissions analysis remains valid, but that a new air quality conformity determination is required.

WFRC staff and the RGC recommend the Regional Council direct WFRC staff to update the RTP amendment process as presented, and make minor technical modifications as may be needed from time to time, in consultation with the RGC Chair and Vice Chair.

BACKGROUND:

Every four years, WFRC prepares and adopts the RTP as the core transportation plan within the overall <u>Wasatch Choice Vision</u>. While the RTP receives considerable review before being formally adopted, circumstances may warrant a change to the RTP after its initial adoption, including funding availability, local and state needs, changes to land use, the determination of final environmental impact statements, or the rapid development of certain projects.

WFRC has a written RTP amendment process that was last updated by the Regional Council in January 2022. There are three different levels or types of amendments:

- Level 3 Full Amendment for Regionally Significant Projects addresses changes to regionally significant projects, such as principal arterials, freeways, or fixed guideway transit. This category requires a 30-day public comment process and an air-quality conformity analysis.
- Level 2 Board Modification (Non-Exempt, Non-Regionally Significant Projects) addresses projects including collectors and minor arterials, corridor preservation for roadway and transit, operational projects with modifications to signalized intersections, and non-fixed guideway transit. It requires a public comment period during the RGC meeting and allows the RGC to approve the amendment during the meeting.
- Level 1 Staff Modification (Exempt Projects) addresses roadway ownership changes, operational roadway projects without modifications to signalized intersections, active transportation projects, and modifications to Wasatch Choice Vision land use centers. Level 1 amendments require approval by the WFRC Executive Director in consultation with the RGC Chair and Vice-chair.

PROPOSED CLARIFICATIONS:

Proposed process clarification 1: Inclusion of amendments that only modify a project's needs-based phase (the timing of anticipated need independent of anticipated funding)

During the development of the RTP, WFRC uses a two-tiered phasing process in which WFRC, in consultation with the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), the Utah Transit Authority (UTA), and local communities, divides all projects into temporal phases. First, projects are phased based on when a project is needed. Second, that phasing may be adjusted based on

fiscal constraints. Therefore, projects have both "needs-based phasing" and "fiscally constrained phasing." The official, adopted RTP is the fiscally constrained plan. Outside of the regular quadrennial process of developing and adopting the RTP, the RTP Amendment Process does not expressly account for the possibility of an amendment where **only** the needs-based phasing changes, and the fiscally constrained phasing does not change. There are also no federal requirements for needs-based phasing; it is a supplemental, value-adding element of WFRC's planning approach. Changing needs-based phasing does not require changes to modeling, air quality conformity analysis, or fiscal constraint analysis, all of which are required by federal law for the fiscally constrained RTP. However, needs-based phasing is an important element of the planning process, and is relevant because projects that are identified as phase 1 needs are more likely to be considered for potential funding and associated land use changes than projects in later phases. It is recommended that the RTP Amendment Process clarify that RTP amendments that only make a needs-based phasing change should be considered to be a Level 1: Staff Modification amendment under the RTP Amendment Process.

Per the current RTP Amendment Process, Level 1 amendments require approval by the WFRC Executive Director in consultation with the RGC Chair and Vice-chair, and subsequent informing of RGC and the RGC Technical Advisory Committee. The WFRC Staff and/or RGC Chair/Vice-Chair can recommend a proposed amendment be elevated from Level 1: Staff Modification to Level 2: Board Modification based on factors including: potential impacts, professional judgment, or potential lack of consensus.

Proposed process clarification 2: Clarification that Level 1 amendments (the least complex modifications), which are subject to the approval by the WFRC Executive Director, require consultation with affected communities and/or transportation agencies, the Federal Highway Administration, the Interagency Consultation Team, and the Regional Growth Committee (RGC) Chair and Vice-Chair.

Level 1 amendments require adequate analysis and evaluation of a proposed amendment. They also require WFRC staff consultation with the facility owner (e.g., UDOT, UTA, city, or county), Interagency Consultation Team (ICT) (composed of federal and state air quality and transportation agencies), and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Per the current RTP Amendment Process, they require the approval by the WFRC Executive Director, in consultation with the RGC Chair and Vice-Chair, and informing the RGC and the RGC Technical Advisory Committees of the amendment. WFRC Staff and RGC recommends clarifying this process, including that any affected communities and/or transportation agencies would be consulted.

Proposed process clarification 3: clarification that for Level 2 amendments, the existing regional emissions analysis remains valid, but that a new air quality conformity determination is required

Level 2 amendments can proceed without a new regional emission analysis, if the Interagency Consultation Team determines that the proposed changes do not involve significant changes in design or scope to regionally significant facilities. However, Level 2 amendments do require a new conformity determination. WFRC Staff and RGC recommends clarifying this requirement in the "procedure" section of Level 2 amendments.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Regional Growth Committee and WFRC staff requests that the Wasatch Front Regional Council make a motion to *"direct WFRC staff to update the RTP amendment process as presented, and make minor technical modifications as may be needed from time to time, in consultation with the RGC Chair and Vice Chair."*

BACKGROUND:

The <u>Wasatch Choice Vision</u> provides guiding principles and strategies for addressing growth throughout the region that local governments can then take and implement on the local level. WFRC knows that this requires time and resources of our communities. To assist with local planning and the implementation of the Vision, we provide several opportunities for our communities to receive technical assistance. This may be broadly, through TLC, or more specifically, such as funding and staff support with <u>Station Area Planning</u> as required under HB462.

The <u>Transportation and Land Use Connection Program</u> (TLC) provides technical assistance to local communities to help them achieve their goals and plan for growth. The TLC program is a partnership between WFRC and funding partners Salt Lake County, UDOT, and UTA.

During the March RGC meeting, we announced the latest projects, including five projects in the Ogden-Layton urban area, five in the Salt Lake urban area, and one project in Tooele County. This totals over \$1.5 million in funded technical assistance. Our team is eager to work with these communities to help them achieve their visions.

At the March 21st Regional Growth Committee (RGC) meeting, WFRC staff and community representatives presented an overview of the various planning technical assistance programs and opportunities. After announcing the 2024 Transportation and Land use Connection (TLC) Awarded Projects, RGC considered certification requests for stations in West Jordan and Midvale, in accordance with the Station Area Planning (SAP) components of state law and WFRC policy. RGC made a positive recommendation to the Council for certification of these SAPs.

For Item 5b.2, the West Jordan stations include Bingham Junction, Historic Gardner, and West Jordan City Center. The Midvale station areas in Item 5b.3 include Bingham Junction, Historic Gardner, Midvale Fort Union & Midvale Center. Representatives from each city will share highlights from these station area plans.

BACKGROUND:

The <u>Wasatch Choice Vision</u> provides guiding principles and strategies for addressing growth throughout the region that local governments can then take and implement on the local level. WFRC knows that this requires time and resources of our communities. To assist with local planning and the implementation of the Vision, we provide several opportunities for our communities to receive technical assistance. This may be broadly, through the <u>Transportation</u> and <u>Land Use Connection (TLC)</u>, or more specifically, such as funding and staff support with Station Area Planning as required under HB462.

<u>HB462</u>, passed in 2022, as amended in 2023, requires cities with fixed-guideway transit stations to develop a Station Area Plan for the area around the station, within ½ mile for rail and ¼ mile for bus rapid transit. <u>Station Area Plans</u> (SAPs) are intended to promote housing availability and affordability, access to opportunities, sustainable environmental conditions, and transportation choices and connections. The <u>SAP requirements</u> are consistent with communities' identification of <u>Wasatch Choice Vision</u> centers.

STATION AREA PLAN CERTIFICATION

WFRC staff has been assisting communities in their development of their station area plans, in partnership with UTA, GOEO, and the Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG). At the RGC meeting, WFRC staff will provide an update on Station Area Planning to date, and discuss the SAPs that have been submitted to WFRC for certification, pursuant to state law and WFRC policy.

State law establishes that the Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs – WFRC and MAG) have the responsibility to review and, in consultation with UTA, certify each SAP for compliance with statutory requirements. In May of 2022, and amended in March of 2023, WFRC adopted a policy for the certification review of SAPs.

WFRC has recently had the opportunity to assist West Jordan and Midvale in planning around stations within their community. The two cities worked together on a plan for the Bingham Junction, Historic Gardner, and West Jordan City Center stations. Both Bingham Junction and

Historic Gardner have station areas that span across the borders of both of these communities. Concurrently, Midvale has been working on plans for Midvale Fort Union and Midvale Center. Taking a network approach to station area planning, and demonstrating effective collaboration, both of these communities have completed these planning processes, and have adopted the resulting plans.

ACTION: Certify West Jordan Stations

In accordance with our policy, WFRC staff has reviewed the submission to assess its satisfaction of the requirements of the statute, and made a <u>positive recommendation for</u> <u>certification</u> to the Regional Growth Committee, who then recommended Council certify the SAP. All of the documentation is included within, including:

ACTION: Certify Midvale Stations

In accordance with our policy, WFRC staff has reviewed the submissions to assess their satisfaction of the requirements of the statute, and makes a <u>positive recommendation for</u> <u>certification</u> to the Regional Growth Committee, who then recommended Council certify the SAPs. BACKGROUND:

Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC) staff, in coordination with the WFRC Budget Committee, has identified proposed agency goals and prepared a draft budget and Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) that outline the objectives and activities that WFRC plans to undertake in fiscal year 2025.

The WFRC Budget Committee reviewed the suggested goals, draft budget and UPWP on March 14, 2024, and the Regional Council is scheduled to review these items at its meeting on March 28, 2024. The Regional Council will then make these available for review by the public and by the County Councils of Governments (COGs). After considering any comments received, the Regional Council will approve the goals and adopt a final budget and UPWP in May 2024. Below is a description and list of the goals, a summary of the UPWP, and discussion about key aspects of the budget. The Budget Committee recommends that the Council make a motion to release for review and comment the draft WFRC goals, budget and Unified Planning Work Program for FY25.

WFRC Goals

Each year WFRC adopts a high-level set of goals and priorities to help shape its activities for the next year. These goals are developed through review of the WFRC's adopted <u>Mission &</u> <u>Roles</u>, reflection on the agency activities and accomplishments for the previous year, and a discussion among the WFRC staff, in consultation with the WFRC Council leadership. The goals are not meant to be a comprehensive list of all of WFRC's activities, but rather to articulate priority activities for the agency in FY25. The WFRC Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) comprehensively lists all of WFRC's activities. These goals are for WFRC as an organization; they are not intended to be goals for the condition of the region. The <u>Wasatch Choice Vision</u> goals, as adopted by the WFRC Council, serve that purpose.

The proposed WFRC FY25 goals are as follows:

- Collaboratively advance the Wasatch Choice Vision as a framework for integrating transportation, land use, and economic development, to address growth-related opportunities and challenges, and maintain and enhance quality of life
- 2. Effectively administer ongoing plans and programs
- 3. Provide subject-matter expertise to federal, state, and local officials and policymakers
- 4. Strive for organizational excellence

Not surprisingly, the FY25 goals are similar to the FY24 goals. This reflects the continuity in our organizational mission and roles, and the fact that most of our activities are ongoing and span multiple years. The proposed goals, with more detailed descriptions, are included as an exhibit to this memo.

Unified Planning Work Program

The UPWP outlines the work tasks that WFRC will pursue during FY25 in collaboration with cities, counties, UDOT, UTA, and other partners. Among the primary tasks are assisting local communities with growth, transportation, and planning issues; continuing development of the 2027-2050 Regional Transportation Plan, Utah's Unified Transportation Plan, and Wasatch Choice Regional Vision; continuing efforts to update and implement the Transportation Improvement Program; assisting in the development of air quality plans; continuing to utilize and improve analytical capabilities; and engaging with the public and local, state, and federal officials.

Budget Overview

At WFRC, our original budget presented in the spring represents new projects and funding anticipated for the coming fiscal year. We typically see modest growth in our Consolidated Transportation Planning Grant (CPG) and Transportation and Land Use Connection (TLC) programs, and any major changes come from the completion or initiation of projects outside those two main areas. The percentage change noted in our budget references the FY24 budget initially approved in May 2023, compared with the proposed FY25 budget. The primary differences from FY24 to FY25 include anticipated routine adjustments for employee compensation and benefits, and contractual items, particularly reflecting the completion in FY24 of the Household Travel Survey and Safe Streets for All projects, the continuation of Station Area Planning efforts, and the addition of the Power District Transportation Study.

Expenditures:

The FY25 budget functions as a legal limit on expenditures, and of course we do not have to spend everything that is budgeted; in fact we routinely come in under budget. As we move towards and into FY25, we will continue to assess the economy and market and have the ability to make budget adjustments as may be warranted.

The major expenditure in the budget is for employee compensation and benefits, including funding to maintain the current full-time staff of 32. Consistent with past practice, the budget also includes an overall personnel line item increase of seven percent that functions as a cap for employee compensation and benefit adjustments, including group health insurance. WFRC annually surveys peer organizations to remain consistent with cities, counties and the State of Utah with regards to COLA and merit increases.

Consultant contracts represent the second largest expenditure in the FY25 budget. The footnotes to the budget provide details of anticipated consulting contracts. The following are descriptions of three significant areas of consultant expense:

The largest ongoing element of contractual expenditures (approximately \$1.6M in FY25) are for planning and technical assistance on Transportation and Land Use Connection (TLC) program projects funded with WFRC's federal STP funds and contributions from UDOT, UTA, and Salt Lake County, as well as local matching funds. Some of the current TLC projects will not be completed before the end of FY24 and will be carried forward to FY25, with a budget amendment to be made in October 2024 when final accounting for FY24 is completed; this reflects the multi-year nature of the program. Much of the variation in the contractual line item reflects those TLC program consultant expenses, which are fully budgeted in one year and then often roll into the next.

- Station Area Planning funds, provided pursuant to HB462 (2022) through the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity, are shared between MAG and WFRC to provide planning assistance to local communities as they develop the required Station Area Plans and update their general plans and zoning. A total of \$5M was allocated beginning in FY23 to support communities in developing plans for the 88 station areas in Utah; MAG and WFRC are collaborating to use this funding to bring all stations into compliance. These funds are limited, and we anticipate using approximately \$1.5M in FY24 and the remaining \$1.8M in FY25.
- Power District Transportation Study funding of \$500,000, appropriated in the 2024 Legislative Session, will be used to evaluate the transportation opportunities and constraints and develop a plan for improving local access and enhancing multi-modal connectivity throughout the District and nearby area to accommodate potential growth. This study will be conducted collaboratively by WFRC, UDOT, UTA, and Salt Lake City, with the engagement of private sector stakeholders.

All other expenditures in other line items were estimated based on past experience and anticipated changes. The footnotes to the budget provide additional detail on these costs.

Revenues:

Federal transportation formula planning funds (PL and 5303) and Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds continue to be the majority of WFRC's operational revenue. WFRC also receives federal funding for the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and Wasatch Front Economic Development District (WFEDD) work.

State funding comes from the Utah Department of Transportation, the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget, and the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity, supporting planning and technical work in our area. In FY24, GOPB began funding a Local Administrative Advisor, providing administrative support to small Utah communities without administrative staff. WFRC also engages in numerous impactful studies each year, with financial support from our partners at UTA, UDOT and Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) to gather and analyze data.

Consistent with WFRC policy, for FY25 the local county contributions increase by 5.46%, a factor representative of the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) averaged over the prior three completed WFRC fiscal years, July 31, 2020 through June 30, 2023. This funding supports the ongoing financial stability of WFRC.

- The FY25 budget for salaries/benefits assumes: 1) full staffing for the existing 32 positions; 2) a 7% overall increase that functions as a cap for salary and employee benefit cost adjustments, including group health insurance. In FY24 actual salary and benefits expenditures are estimated to be lower than budgeted due to staff vacancies that were filled later in the fiscal year than anticipated.

The contractual line at WFRC varies significantly in different phases of the budgeting process. The initial budget accounts for new projects anticipated in the coming fiscal year, and the October budget amendment (reflected here in the FY24 final budget) expands to include any projects initiated before the fiscal year and still in progress. For FY24, the budget included significant funds in TLC program and joint projects carry forward, as well as large new projects such as the Household Travel Survey (footnote 14), Station Area Planning (footnote 22), and Safe Streets for All (footnote 23). Significant expenses that were new for FY24 (as shown in the increase between FY23 actuals and the FY24 estimates) included the SAP and Household Travel Survey. For FY25, there is one new project, the Power District Transportation Study (footnote 25). Some budgeted expenditures from FY24 will carry forward into FY25 and will be included in the October 2024 budget amendment. This is typical for this organization.

- 3. Dues are for WFRC memberships to various professional organizations such as National Association of Regional Councils and Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations as well as individual professional memberships for WFRC staff.
- 4. Beginning in FY24, Equipment Maintenance costs have been reduced with a new support contract for technology support services.

- 5. WFRC holds insurance through ULGT and the FY25 estimate is not available yet, so the working budget number matches the amended FY24 budget.
- 6. WFRC budgets an amount each year for contingent legal expenses.
- 7. Printing and Publications covers the printing of project reports and brochures, which are needed on a limited basis for distribution at meetings and conferences.
- 8. Supplies, Software and Subscriptions include accounting and GIS software, office supplies, subscriptions to professional publications, and other project materials.
- 9. Telephone/Data budget has increased to reflect a rise in the cost of hybrid and virtual meeting licenses.
- 10. Travel and Training budgets reflect estimates based on FY24 anticipated actuals, and support WFRC staff attending and presenting at professional development conferences.
- 11. The overall initial WFRC budget shows an increase from the FY24 initial budget. This is largely due to anticipated employee compensation and benefit adjustments (footnote 1) as well as the completion of the Household Travel Survey (footnote 14) and the Safe Streets for All Safety Action Plan (footnote 23), continued work on Station Area Planning (footnote 22) and the addition of the Power District Transportation Study (footnote 25). The large decrease from the amended FY24 budget to initial FY25 budget is due to the fact that the initial budget primarily reflects anticipated new projects or baseline ongoing efforts, it does not yet reflect projects that carry forward from FY24 to FY25. The FY24 amended budget reflected here includes all projects that were budgeted in the previous fiscal year FY23 and carried forward to FY24; a similar amendment in October 2024 will be proposed to reflect ongoing projects carried forward from FY24 to FY25.
- 12. The Consolidated Transportation Planning Grant budget is based on the FY25 Unified Planning Work Program and includes new and multi-year projects (see footnote 2 for a list), as well as annual employee compensation and benefit adjustments (footnote 1).
- 13. The Transportation and Land Use Connection (TLC) program budget reflects the multi-year nature of most of the TLC projects. The FY24 final budget of \$6.1M includes projects carried forward from FY23 and new program funds in FY24. All funds through FY24 have been awarded to ongoing multi-year projects. Anticipated expenditures for FY24 are \$3M, including work on projects that have been in process for a few years. The current FY25 budgeted figure of \$2.5M represents the annual contributions to the program plus anticipated local match. These funds are awarded to new projects in March 2024, and an amendment to the FY25 budget will be made in October 2024 after the close out of FY24 to reflect all ongoing projects that are expected to be completed in FY25 and beyond.
- 14. The Household Travel Survey, a joint project between WFRC and many partners including UDOT and several AOGs, concluded at the end of FY24.

- 15. WFRC has received a three year Planning Partnership grant from the Economic Development Administration (EDA) to support the Wasatch Front Regional Economic Development District (WFEDD) from April 2023 to March 2026. A substantial part of this grant was a consulting contract for the five-year CEDS which was not initiated until FY24, and is reflected in the FY24 actual expenses. Also included in FY24 are the final expenses relating to a grant from the EDA administered by the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget for Statewide CEDS planning efforts. The FY25 proposed budget represents current budgeted expenditures for the WFEDD planning efforts. The Statewide CEDS grant ended in FY24, so there are no budgeted expenses for that program.
- 16. Local Government Other WFRC uses local funds to provide the required matching funds in several programs, including the CPG and WFEDD, and to support projects and expenses that do not qualify for other funding. For example, WFRC may use these funds for planning projects in non-urbanized areas that do not qualify for the federal planning dollars allocated to WFRC as an MPO. In FY25, the estimated amount of local funds available for these efforts decreased slightly because of additional matching funds used in FY24 for the Safe Streets for All program.
- 17. WFRC partners with UDOT and Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) for costs associated with Model Development, supporting both staff and limited outside consulting services. The annual MAG contribution to this effort is now reflected in the initial FY25 budget, where in previous years it was recorded in "Dedicated Project Funds" (footnote 32).
- 18. Joint projects are those projects WFRC engages in that include support from UDOT, UTA and Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG). Specific new projects are not yet known for FY25; the budget will be amended for any projects that arise in FY25.
- 19. WFRC staff provide administrative and technical support to Tooele Valley and Morgan County Rural Planning Organizations as they develop and implement transportation plans.
- 20. WFRC staff review applications and assist communities seeking support from the Community Impact Board.
- 21. WFRC staff annually assists Davis County in processing funding applications to utilize transportation sales tax revenue.
- 22. Station Area Planning funds, provided in June 2022 pursuant to HB462 through the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity, are shared between MAG and WFRC to provide planning assistance to local communities as they develop the required Station Area Plans and update their general plans and zoning. A total of \$5M was allocated beginning in FY23 to support communities in developing plans for the 88 station areas in Utah; MAG and WFRC are collaborating to use this funding to bring all stations into compliance. After estimating awards totaling \$1.5M in FY24, the remaining funds

(\$1.8M) are now budgeted in FY25. This budget line will be amended in October 2024, to reflect actual awards in FY24 and include all remaining funds.

- 23. The Safe Streets for All federal grant was awarded in January 2023, a total of \$969,000 made up of federal, state and local funding. The project will conclude in FY24.
- 24. Beginning in FY24, the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget provided \$150,000 to each Association of Governments (AOG) in Utah to fund a Local Administrative Advisor. This new state-funded program provides administrative support to small cities, towns and communities without administrative staff. WFRC currently has 16 communities without this administrative staff.
- 25. In the 2024 Legislative Session, funds were appropriated for the Utah Department of Transportation to grant directly to WFRC for the Power District Transportation Study this study will evaluate the transportation opportunities and constraints and develop a plan for improving local access and enhancing multi-modal connectivity throughout the District and nearby area to accommodate potential growth. This study will be conducted collaboratively by WFRC, UDOT, UTA, and Salt Lake City, with the engagement of private sector stakeholders.
- 26. The increase in Federal Highway Administration PL funds from FY23 actual to FY24 budget included costs for consulting contracts that were not completed by the end of FY23 and were carried forward to the FY24 budget. The estimated FY24 expenditures are lower than anticipated due to staffing vacancies that were filled later in the year than expected and consulting contracts that are not expected to be completed by the end of FY24 and will carry forward into the next fiscal year. The FY25 proposed budget of \$6.2M reflects employee compensation and benefit adjustments and new and ongoing projects (footnote 12).
- 27. Consistent with the regular practice of the WFRC Council, the FY25 budget continues to include a modest portion of the STP funding to support our overall planning work (3.7% of the total STP amount), and to support the TLC Program (3.6% of the total STP amount). The FY24 estimated to be spent reflects some TLC projects that are not expected to be completed by the end of FY24 and will carry forward into FY25 (footnote 13). The Council typically amends its budget in October of each year when the final accounting is completed to include those contracts in process. This is a reflection of the multi-year nature of many of WFRC's projects.
- 28. Federal Transit Administration funding includes \$881,435 in funds for the Consolidated Planning Grant (CPG) program and \$5,000 for Mobility Management through UTA. This is the current estimate, and may be adjusted in the October amendment.
- 29. WFRC receives \$50,000 each year from the Dept of Housing and Urban Development to assist small cities to apply for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.
- 30. The Governor's Office of Planning and Budget has provided \$140,000 each year as a match to the CPG program, to support WFRC's planning work. An additional \$150,000 of

ongoing funding was approved during the 2022 Utah State Legislative Session to support technical planning assistance for local communities.

- 31. Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) and Utah Transit Authority (UTA) provide ongoing funding for the TLC program, at annual rates that are agreed upon by multi-year agreements (\$315,000 from UDOT and \$300,000 from UTA through FY25). The amended budget reflects dedicated UDOT/UTA funds for ongoing TLC projects that did not complete before the end of the prior fiscal year and were carried forward. An adjustment will be made in October 2024 to reflect these ongoing projects.

In October, this budget line will be amended to include carry forward funds for dedicated projects that are ongoing including local matching funds for the TLC program and joint projects. Model development funds from MAG have moved from this line to footnote 17.

- 33. Transit Sales Tax funds from UTA are used to match the Federal Transit Administration Section 5303 fund and to fund specific activities to support transit planning and implementation efforts.
- 34. Consistent with the approach established by the Council during the FY18 budget process, the FY25 budget includes a 5.46% increase in local contributions. This increase represents a three-year average of the change in Consumer Price Index as measured from July 2020 through June 2023.
- 35. Intermountain Healthcare provided a donation of \$500,000 in two annual installments of \$250,000 in FY22 and FY23 for community development activities including (but not limited to) public assets development, local technical assistance and social determinants of health. The funds have been allocated to ongoing projects in the Transportation and Land Use Connection program, where any remaining funds are now reflected.

To increase access to transit services by people walking or biking through transportationpartner-coordinated identification and funding of priority first-/last-mile infrastructure projects.

To continue to refine RTP performance measures, to evaluate individual and system-level improvements throughout the 2027-2050 RTP development process, to set appropriate performance measure targets, and monitor progress towards the Wasatch Choice Vision.

To develop shared approaches to address local and regional disruptive technologies and external uncertainties, including climate change and resiliency.

To identify and understand policies that affect the transportation system from land use, economic development, travel demand, equity, environmental, and financial perspectives.

To increase and coordinate efforts in planning related to safety for all road users with the most relevant and up to date data and tools, especially as it relates to vulnerable road users such as pedestrians and cyclists.

To coordinate and increase emphasis with transportation partners and key stakeholders for statewide, regional, and local freight issues.

To plan for transportation while understanding the effects of and impacts upon land use, regional development patterns, economic development, and historically underserved and underrepresented communities.

To be responsive to local community and transportation partner requests for amendments to the 2023-2050 RTP.

At the Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC) meeting, the Council will hear an update on the 2023 Utah Moves Transportation Survey.

BACKGROUND:

Approximately every 10 years, Utah's major transportation partners conduct a statewide survey of household travel patterns and variables related to travel decision making. The travel information results are vital to calibrating the state's seven travel demand models that make projections of travel, traffic volumes, and transit ridership, to reflect key trends that impact the utilization and performance of our transportation system.

The most recent survey, branded as the 2023 Utah Moves Transportation Survey, was conducted during the first half of 2023, with a smaller supplemental with additional attitudinal and preference questions in the Fall.

The 2023 statewide household travel survey collected a broad set of demographic and travel behavior data from a representative sample of over 11,000 households in the state of Utah. The households participating in the core travel survey, which had website, mobile app, and call center response options, represented 29,873 persons and 389,089 trips across 56,633 complete person-days from February 15 to June 30, 2023.

This presentation will introduce the 2023 transportation survey, results and resources to members of the Council.
