BEN McADAMS Mayor, Salt Lake County

Ben McAdams was sworn into office for his second term as Salt Lake County Mayor on January 9, 2017. McAdams is a fiscal conservative who works across party lines to expand opportunities for residents. He has emphasized education, economic development and job growth, and has fostered innovation in government. McAdams works collaboratively to make a measurable difference in tackling big issues, such as criminal justice and homelessness.



BRUCE J. KATZ Centennial Scholar, Brookings Institution

As the inaugural Centennial Scholar at the Brookings Institution, Bruce Katz focuses on the challenges and opportunities of global urbanization. He was previously vice president and co-director of the Brookings Metropolitan Policy Program, which he founded in 1996. He is one of the leaders of the Brookings Project on 21st Century City Governance and is the coauthor of *The New Localism and The Metropolitan Revolution*.



JEREMY NOWAK

Non-Resident Senior Fellow, Brookings Institution

Jeremy Nowak, coauthor of *The New Localism*, is a Distinguished Visiting Fellow at Drexel University's Lindy Institute for Urban Innovation. He created The Reinvestment Fund, one of the largest community investment institutions in the U.S., and chaired the Board of the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia. He is also the chief strategist for Spring Point Partners and currently chairs the board of The Philadelphia Citizen.
