

Street Future Series Introduction

The interconnection of streets influences the built environment, social interactions and mobility throughout a community. Future streets should be mapped and planned for in order to appropriately and efficiently increase the street network. This series depicts how and where the land for street future may exist. While viewing these photos you may choose to consider how the following keywords apply to each photo. Then, consider how these keywords may apply to the future streets within your community.

Street Future Definition:

An area designated on a map as a “future street” which is proposed to be used as a new or enlarged public right of way at some time in the future as may be necessary to provide access to certain property or as may be necessary to provide for adequate street widths. (*Glendale, California*)

Keywords:

access management, appropriately located, area designated on a map, corridor preservation, cul-de-sacs, dead ends, grid system, interconnected with existing and future streets, necessary to provide access, new or enlarged public right of way, protected from any permanent structure, walkability (pedestrian access)
