Preserving transportation corridors helps to avoid increased costs for expanding transportation facilities and utilities, as well as reduces the displacement of homes and businesses. Transit Definition:

Passenger services provided by public, private, or nonprofit entities such as the following surface transit modes: commuter rail, light rail, bus rapid transit, express bus, and local fixed route bus. (*Temple Terrace, Florida*)

Keywords:

appropriate location, coordinate development and maintenance of significant facilities, coordinate with adjacent communities, efficient use of existing infrastructure, planning for future streets, poor street design, preserve corridors for future infrastructure needs, promote transfer of development rights out of the corridor, regional mobility, right-of-way, utility corridors, variety of interconnected transportation choices
