Proactive Transportation-related Air Quality Strategies

Peter Jager's presentation included information on UDOT statewide signal coordination efforts. Some of the discussion items included:

- All cities share the same ITS (Intelligent Transportation Systems) communications
- All cities share ATMS (Advanced Traffic Management Systems)
- Signal Performance Metrics
- How phases terminate by time-of-day
- Lane-by-lane volume counts
- Measuring corridor travel time

Updates on Air Quality Improvement Activities

- UCAIR Grant Programs – Ted Wilson
Andrew Gruber is on the UCAIR Board of Governors. The board initiatives include educating the general public and alerting them to air quality issues. There are ways the public can assist with the inversion with their behavior changes.
- DAQ Report – Dave McNeill
The last year was spent getting the new SIP adopted to meet the requirements of the clean air act. The introduction of Tier 2 cars was discussed as well as Tier 3 cars and fuel. Tier 3 cars will help air quality significantly. Area sources are becoming the major source of air pollution along the Wasatch Front.
