Approval of Meeting Summary

Mayor Carmen Freeman moved that the meeting minutes for October 16, 2014 be approved. The motion was seconded by John Petroff and the minutes were unanimously approved.

DAQ update

Bryce Bird's presentation included information on PM2.5 SIP, proposed ozone standard, and PM10 SIP. The deadline for public comment to the EPA on the proposed ozone standard is March 17, 2015. The Utah Air Quality Board is currently attaining the standard for PM10. There is a plan to propose a new PM10 SIP by September 2015.

Draft RTP Conformity

Kip Billings presented the draft RTP conformity report. There is a new emissions model (MOVES 2014) from the EPA and WFRC is making sure that we are meeting the federal requirements. In 2017, the Tier 3 vehicle standards will be in effect. Emissions will be lower if using Tier 3 fuel.

Legislative Report on Air Quality Issues

Andrew Gruber reported on transportation funding. There seems to be an interest this year to address the short falls in transportation funding. If there are more options for transit service and the public utilizes these services there will be a direct effect on air quality.

Mayor JoAnn Seghini asked that Breathe Utah prepare a list of resources and contacts for the next AQC meeting so that the information can be given to our local communities and schools.
