Active Transportation Outcomes

- SB 185 Utah Trails Network
 - \$45M one-time
 - \$45M ongoing
 - Creates the "Active Transportation Investment Fund"
- SB 27 TTIF Match Requirement Reduced 40% ☐ 30%
 - TTIF Active (First-/Last Mile Projects)
- HB 224 + HB 344 Outdoor Recreation Amendments
 - Creates initiative to manage, maintain, expand, restore, outdoor recreation trails through partnership and stewardship agreements

Note that no notable "anti-bike" bills did not pass this legislative session.
