<p><b>Welcome and Introductions</b> – Spencer Brimley, Clearfield City Community Development Director</p>	<p>Spencer Brimley, Community Development Director at Clearfield City introduced the meeting and welcomed the attendees. RGC TAC was held via Zoom.</p>	<p>None Required</p>
<p><b>1. Meeting Summary</b> – February 17, 2021 Minutes</p>	<p>Spencer Brimley, Community Development Director at Clearfield City, called for a motion to approve the February 17, 2021 minutes.</p> <p>Steve Parkinson motioned to approve February 17, 2021 minutes, with Mayor Joy Petro seconding that motion.</p>	<p>Approved</p>
<p><b>2. Amendment #3 – 2019-2050 RTP</b> – Jory Johner, WFRC Long Range Planning Manager</p>	<p>Jory Johner, WFRC Long Range Planning Manager, gave a presentation on the proposed 2019-2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Amendment #3. Jory detailed the one staff level project, eight proposed board level amendments projects, and 13 full amendment projects to the 2019-2050 RTP. He noted that there are three different categories of amendments based on their level of significance and each level has a slightly different <a href="#">process</a>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Level 1 Amendment Process–Staff Modification–includes coordinating with the Chair and Vice Chair of RGC with final approval by the WFRC Executive Director. This process also requires informing the RGC TAC’s and RGC.</li> <li>● Level 2 Amendment Process–Board Modification–includes a review of technical considerations consistent with the planning process and review and recommendations by the RGC TAC and approval by the RGC.</li> <li>● Level 3 Amendment Process–Full Amendment–Regionally significant projects requiring technical considerations, air quality conformity, and a 30-day public comment period with final approval by the Regional Council.</li> </ul> <p>A motion that the Regional Growth Committee approve the Level 2 board modification projects and the Level 3 full amendment projects have a 30-day public comment in June and/or July was made by Sherrie Pace, with Steve Parkinson seconding the motion.</p>	<p>Approved</p>

<p><b>3. TLC 2021 Awards</b> - Megan Townsend, WFRC Community and Economic Development Director</p>	<p>Megan Townsend, WFRC Community and Economic Development Director, gave an update on the <a href="#">2021 Awarded Projects</a> for the TLC Program. The <a href="#">TLC Program</a> provides technical assistance to local communities to help them achieve their goals and plan for growth. The program helps communities implement changes to the built environment that reduce traffic and enable more people to easily walk, bike, and use transit.</p> <p>There are 16 awards in 21 communities with four being multi-jurisdictional projects</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● 8 Salt Lake Urbanized Area</li> <li>● 7 Ogden/Layton Urbanized Area</li> <li>● 1 Morgan County</li> </ul> <p>Megan detailed TLC Program resources. <p><b>4. Golden Spoke</b> - Hugh Van Wagenen, WFRC Active Transportation Planner</p>	<p>Hugh Van Wagenen, WFRC active transportation planner, covered the details and history of the Golden Spoke Trail.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● 100+ mile paved trail from Ogden to Provo</li> <li>● Longest connected paved trail west of the Mississippi</li> <li>● Covers 33 cities</li> <li>● 16.5% live within one mile</li> <li>● 42% live within three miles</li> </ul> <p>The 4th Annual Golden Spoke will be held during the month June of 2021. You can participate at any time during the month and record your participation online. One Spoke Isn't a Wheel - Advancing the Next Big Ideas or Bicycling (Discussion)</b> - Spencer Brimley</p>	<p>Hugh Van Wagenen, WFRC Active Transportation Planner, opened by highlighting various bike projects that are high comfort and made with all ages and abilities in mind.</p> <p>Discussion was opened up by Spencer Brimley and Hugh Van Wagenen. Discussions covered funding barriers, connections of trails, safety between transportation modes, communication between transportation agencies, cities, and communities, and scooter ordinances. <a href="#">Link to discussion boards</a>.</p>	<p>None Required</p>

<p><b>6. Wasatch Choice and General Plan Updates</b> – Megan Townsend, WFRC Community and Economic Development Director</p>	<p>Megan Townsend, WFRC Community and Economic Development Director, opened up with the highlights from the survey following the fall workshops. There were 51 responses. Here are a few survey highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 68% said current zoning implements, in some way, the communities Wasatch Choice center(s)</li> <li>• 92% of respondents have planned for active transportation as required by SB34</li> <li>• 73% of communities have correlated their transportation plan with population and employment projections as required by SB34</li> <li>• 78% of general plans consider the RTP</li> <li>• 71% feel the RTP is consistent with their transportation vision for their community</li> <li>• 66% said training would make them more likely to utilize WFRC map resources; 60% said community examples would help</li> </ul> <p>Megan then walked through a few Wasatch Choice Regional Vision resources.</p> <p>Please contact Megan Townsend at <a href="mailto:mtownsend@wfr.org">mtownsend@wfr.org</a> for additional information.</p>	<p>None Required</p>
