<b>Welcome and Introductions</b>  Spencer Brimley, Clearfield City Community Development Director	Spencer Brimley, Clearfield City Community Development Director, introduced the meeting and welcomed the attendees. RGC TAC was held via Zoom.	None Required
<b>Meeting Summary –</b> September 21, 2022 Minutes	Spencer Brimley, Clearfield City Community Development Director, called for a motion to approve the September 21, 2022 meeting summary. Layton City Mayor Joy Petro motioned to approve, with Dave Petersen of Farmington, giving a second.	Approved
<b>Regionally Significant Projects / Housing</b> WFRC Staff	<p><b>Context Sensitivity:</b> Ted Knowlton, WFRC Deputy Director, gave a presentation on context sensitivity in Utah's local and regional planning. WFRC, UDOT, UTA, Governor's office of Planning and Budget, and MAG got together to discuss how we can explore the level of predictability in addressing context sensitivity. Ted asked the technical advisory committee for interest in involvement.</p> <p>Ted presented the Wasatch Choice Great Street–A framework for balancing transportation needs with community context and vision. Ted discussed the Wasatch Choice centers on the <a href="#">Wasatch Choice Interactive Map</a> and how this is an agreed upon</p> <p>Proposed framework: Each element can have a series of tools:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Principles: overall general statements of guidance</li><li>● Checklist: things to review or consider</li><li>● Considerations: how to work through trade-offs</li><li>● Performance measures: measures the degree to which regional-level streets meet thresholds</li></ul> <p>Initial idea is for four broad types oriented to the street's role in the center:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Main streets</li><li>● Major corridors</li><li>● Hybrid main streets</li></ul>	None Required

**2023-2050 RTP update:** Jory Johner, WFRC Manager Long Range Planning Group, gave an update on the 2023-2050 Regional Transportation Plan, the transportation element of the [Wasatch Choice Vision](#). This plan is multimodal, updated every four years, is fiscally constrained, and conforms to air quality standards.

Jory discussed where we've been:

- Explored external forces and policies
- Created a draft preferred scenario
- Created the needs-based phasing for the projects
- Fiscally constrained the plan

What is next in the RTP development timeline:

- Public comment and final adoption

Jory gave an overview of the recently completed 2022 Fall Transportation Workshops across the region. He also covered the extensive stakeholder outreach that happened to the following agencies/landholders/community organizations

At the last technical advisory committee meeting, we received 100 roadway comments, 68 transit comments, and 185 active transportation comments. The Long Range Planning Group followed up with communities and stakeholders who provided comments.

Jory then discussed the funding available for the life of this plan and how that breaks down compared to the needs for each mode. The needs for active transportation, roadway, and transit all exceed the expected revenue.

<p><b>Disruptive Technology and Policy</b></p> <p>Jared Esselman, UDOT Director of Aeronautics</p>	<p>Jared Esselman, UDOT Director of Aeronautics, gave a presentation on Disruptive Technology and Policies.</p> <p>Advanced Air Mobility in Utah – Happening today</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 2022–Zipline Partnership with Intermountain HealthCare (IHC) for Household Medical Delivery</li> <li>• 2022–Walmart Partners with DroneUp to start USA Delivery in Utah</li> </ul> <p>Emerging Use Cases:</p>	None Required

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Air Cargo</li> <li>• Passenger Air Mobility</li> <li>• Emergency Services</li> </ul> <p>The industry timeline is aggressive and quick, there is currently already drone package delivery in the state, and once there is approval from the FAA, this technology is going to boom in the region. There are discussions about drone taxis happening in the next decade.</p> <p>Phased Approach:</p> <p>Phase I: 2-3 years - meet current demand</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Community engagement</li> <li>• Unmanned traffic monitoring</li> <li>• Weather reporting &amp; monitoring</li> </ul> <p>Phase II: 2-5 years - Ogden-Provo</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Expand infrastructure capacity for traffic monitoring/advisories</li> <li>• Initial Vertiport infrastructure</li> </ul> <p>Phase III: 7-15 years - Wasatch Front</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Aviation &amp; transportation plan development</li> <li>• Traffic management/advisories for airspace above Wasatch Front</li> <li>• Expanded vertiport infrastructure</li> </ul> <p>Phase IV: 15-30 years - Statewide connections</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Connecting urban and rural communities</li> <li>• Building efficiency/accessibility into the AAm system</li> <li>• Energy resiliency in rural areas/underserved communities</li> </ul> <p>Dave Peterson asked how long will it be until we have drone carriers big enough to get over a fire and drop water?
