TIF/TTIF Project Nominations Stephanie Tomlin, UDOT Trails Division Leader	<p>Stephanie Tomlin provided information and updates about the TIF/TTIF project prioritization process. Project nomination window is open from June 26th - August 31st 2023.</p> <p>Transportation Investment Fund (TIF) - there are two programs where dollars can be programmed, TIF Active and TIF Highway. TIF Active involves pedestrian and non-motorized paved facilities that demonstrate congestion reduction on a state facility and requires a 40% match. This funding is for active transportation construction. TIF Highway utilizes phase 1 fiscally constrained projects in Utah's Unified Transportation Plan that are over \$5M and puts them into the project prioritization model for funding considerations.</p> <p>Transit Transportation Investment Fund (TTIF) - consists of two programs, TTIF Transit and TTIF First/Last mile. The match requirement for TTIF has been updated, it is now 30%.</p> <p>TTIF and TIF Active are nomination based.</p> <p>UDOT is asking previous projects to be nominated</p>	None Required

There is street typology that ranges from pedestrian-oriented to automobile-oriented.
