Actively Implementing the Trails Master Plan Trails committee formally created in 2016 Tasked with creating a Master Plan and trail network to meet the needs of all types, disperse trail use, and improve trail access points Master Plan was developed in 2019 with Blueline Design Master Plan was developed in 2019 with Blueline Design In 2022 the city was awarded \$500,000 trail grant from Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant Voters approved of a trail/park bond of \$8 million dollars for the construction of Washington Park and trails Trail construction started in 2023 To date there are 34 miles of various trail types	None Required

Engagement in the RTP Jory Johner, WFRC, Long Range Planning Manager	 Regional Transportation Plan Timeline The 2027-2055 RTP process started by looking at exploratory projects. The Long Range Planning (LRP) team collected project ideas and comments at the Fall 2024 workshops. Winter to fall of 2025 the LRP team will be creating a preferred scenario. This year the team will be identifying which projects will be needed by 2055. 	None Required

- Winter to fall of 2026 projects will then be reviewed to see when projects are needed with expected revenues.
 In May of 2027 the LRP team will have a draft ready for review by the Wasatch Front Regional Council members.
 Transportation Project Evaluation
 Projects captured from the current RTP, existing studies, and during the fall
 - Projects captured from the current RTP, existing studies, and during the fall workshops will be put through various levels of screening throughout the RTP process.
 - The first step is a preliminary screening, where projects will either be moved forward as a concept for consideration or not moved forward.
 - The second step is a Technical evaluation, if a project meets the technical screening criteria it will be moved forward into the RTP preferred scenario. If the project does not meet the criteria it will be placed in an exploratory concepts document for possible use in the future.
- How the TAC will be involved
 - July 30: Review preliminary and technical screened projects, update Travel Demand Model, update population and employment projects, update Wasatch Choice Vision Centers, review draft preferred scenario, input on phasing criteria.
 - September 17: Review draft preferred scenario, review phasing criteria
 - December 10: Review comments from Fall 2025 Workshops, review phasing criteria
