Salt Lake County open space needs assessment Martin Jensen, Salt Lake County and Holly Yocom, Salt Lake County	In 2012 Salt Lake County Park and Recreation conducted a needs assessment survey of residents to help determine top priorities for recreational facilities, park, open space, and programs for communities, In 2017, Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation conducted a second needs assessment survey to further establish top priorities. In 2021, the County is completing another needs assessment for comparison to see how our communities are growing and what their priorities are. Once the data is collected, it will be broken up by zip code and demographic. This data will be shared with cities to let them know what their residents' top priorities are concerning parks and recreation. Data will be analyzed by the end of the year with cities being contacted by the first of the new year. Ted then highlighted a new resource that WFRC has, the Access to Opportunities Map, which shows how many destinations a household can get to in a reasonable commute or how many jobs you can access by car/transit. Regional Transportation Plan (amendment process update, amendment #4 report, fall workshops, equity in the RTP) Jory Johner, WFRC Director of Long-Range Planning Nikki Navio, WFRC Transportation Planner Lauren Victor, WFRC Transportation Planner	Amendment Process Update: periodic adjustments are needed to the Regional Transportation Plan which is done through our amendment process. In the Spring of 2020, WFRC updated the amendment process to streamline and recategorize a handful of project types. This latest update was adopted by the Regional Council at their August 2021 board meeting. There were two main modifications – first was the inclusion of consultation from the FHWA in the making of RTP project revisions and second was to provide more flexibility and responsiveness in updating Wasatch Choice Vision Centers. Amendment #4 to the 2019-2050 RTP Report: WFRC staff worked with local communities and planners to refine and update the Wasatch Choice Vision Centers this last summer. These updates are a Level 1 Staff Modification and are now live on all WFRC interactive maps, a .pdf of the Vision poster is available, and the center's data is available as a shapefile in the data portal on the WFRC website.
