Household and jobs Forecast Viewer WFRC Analytics Group	<ul> <li>Bert Granberg, WFRC Director of Analytics, opened up with a presentation of the Draft Household and Job Forecast (2021-2050). This forecast uses state of the practice tools, regional data resources, community feedback, and professional judgment to forecast the distribution of population, households, and employment by major sector, annually through 2050 – using GPI county control totals. Park Rx Utah Introduction Sarah Kinnison	Sarah Kinnison, Health Educator and Program Manager, gave an introduction to Park Rx Utah, which was founded in 2018 with partners ranging from public health, park and recreation, healthcare, research, etc. Discussed getting outside in the name of health through prescribed outdoor time. Sarah went over the benefits of spending time outdoors like decreasing anxiety and depression, improving glucose levels in patients with diabetes, decreasing high blood pressure, and increased opportunities to improve and retain sustainable health behaviors. Sarah discussed that park prescriptions can address health equity issues so that everyone has a fair and just opportunity to be healthy. A park prescription can identify a place, activity, frequency, and duration of the prescribed outdoor time.	None Required

2023 RTP Phased Fiscally Constrained Projects WFRC Long Range Planning Group	Jory Johner, WFRC Manager of the Long-Range Planning Group, presented on the draft Fiscal Constraint Phasing for the 2023-2050 RTP. Jory Gave an overview of the <u>Wasatch Choice Vision</u> and the <u>Regional Transportation Plan</u> . Jory discussed updates to the Unified Plan Financial Model Development that is used for the long range plans across the state. These updates include growth rates, project costs and operating expenses, assumed new local option sales taxes, state funding for active transportation (TIF AT, TTIF, FLM), and IIJA. Julie Bjornstad, WFRC Senior Transportation Planner, gave an overview of funding available by mode in the draft 2023-2050 RTP. Julie presented on the needs-based phasing totals versus the fiscally constrained totals for the draft plan. The Long-Range Planning Group then had the participants utilize breakout groups to discuss projects in their communities by mode using the <u>Draft 2023 RTP Fiscally Constrained Phase Map</u> .
