| Water and Land Use Planning Chelsea Benjamin, Western Resource Advocates Water Policy Fellow John Berggren, Western Resource Advocates | mikala@wfrc.org. John Berggren opened with context about Western Resource Advocates. Why integrate water and land use planning? It is historically siloed; leading to inefficiencies, significantly reduces the water demand of new and redevelopment, empowers communities to improve water efficiency within their own context, and align water supply and demand to increase resilience to drought and climate change. WHen you integrate your water in land use planning, you can do it at any step along the way. This isn't just for drought, this planning integration also helps with flooding. Recent State Legislation: SB110- requires water to be integrated into a general plan SB118- specifies that for a city to receive funding for landscape conversion, it must adopt water efficient landscaping standards Utah Growing Water Smart Workshop First workshop held in November 2022 Scity and county teams participated Next workshop will be June 2023 Two workshops per year At the first workshop they had 42 community leaders participate, with representatives from The Workshop: 3-day Community teams of 5-7 planners, water managers, and elected officials Develop 12-month action plan Follow-up technical assistance Resources: | None Required |
