<p>TLC Awards and Ordinance Assistance</p> <p>Mikala Jordan, WFRC Community Planner</p>	<p>Mikala Jordan, WFRC Community Planner, presented the 2023 Transportation and Land Use Connection Program Awards. There are 13 awards, 2 regional, WFRC-led efforts. WFRC staff will provide assistance to member communities to implement planning goals through local ordinances. These can be things like identifying barriers and conflict points, identifying opportunities and clarifications, and recommendations for updates and modernizations of code. This program will include a technical review through a sounding committee that will be made up of land use professionals.</p> <p>You can find the ordinance assistance information, as well as the application, on the webpage. <p>Water and Land Use Planning</p> <p>Chelsea Benjamin, Western Resource Advocates Water Policy Fellow</p> <p>John Berggren, Western Resource Advocates</p>	<p>John Berggren opened with context about Western Resource Advocates. Why integrate water and land use planning? It is historically siloed; leading to inefficiencies, significantly reduces the water demand of new and redevelopment, empowers communities to improve water efficiency within their own context, and align water supply and demand to increase resilience to drought and climate change. When you integrate your water in land use planning, you can do it at any step along the way.
