Ben shared list of Letter of Intent. In some cases staff has recommended an alternative source of funds. If you have any projects that were intended for funding but are not on this list please contact Ben. Concept reports are due December 12, 2019.

• Utah Outdoor Recreation Workshop notice was shared with the group. May be helpful with bike and ped project funding. An additional Salt Lake workshop was added for November 20, 2019.

• New WFRC Employee - Hugh Van Wagenen of WFRC introduced a new WFRC employee, Lauren Victor who will assist with transit planning.

3. Information Item – UTA TDM Annual Report Michael Goldman

TDM is Transportation Demand Management. Goal of UTA Rideshare is to reduce single occupant vehicles.

CMAQ funds from Ogden/Layton are about \$157,000 annually or 5% of the operating budget. Rideshare has 469 total vans (72 new vans 2019), 400 active, 30 ready, and 39 loaner vans (retired vans used as backup for breakdowns or maintenance). Working on implementation of automated tracking of maintenance history. Vans are retained 5-6 years and about 125,000 miles. Of 1,600 attempted carpool matches, 1,000 were found, but only 1 carpool was registered with UTA. UTA will collaborate with UDOT Travelwise to improve carpool matching results and reporting.

4. Information Item – ATMS Annual Report Tyler Laing

ATMS is Advanced Traffic Management System. Last year 5 VMS signs were added. A statewide ATMS Master Plan was completed. Layton area I-15 construction will include extension of HOT lanes. Fiber communication will be expanded in the Ogden/Layton area to improve signal operations. Traffic Operations Center Central Software will be upgraded, currently 20+ years old. CCTV cameras will be converted from analog to digital. Connected vehicle technology efforts are expanding. Variable speed limit implemented in Parley's Canyon will be operated remotely and expanded to other areas.

Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSMO) Plan to be completed this year. Plan will identify operational considerations for all new projects.

5. Information Item – TravelWise Annual Report Kim Clark

TravelWise has been in operation for about 9 years with the goals to improve Health, Energy Consumption, Mobility, and Air Quality. They are working with UTA to address "first/last mile" to and from transit. Partnership with Research Park to identify transportation needs. Established "pop up hub" at Marriot Hotel for lunch activities. Developing "Connectivity Policy" implementation. Study of traffic patterns at local schools.

6. Resource Presentation – PI - Approach to Right of Way Fred Lutze

Past experience with public involvement regarding ROW acquisition has been minimal participation. New approach is to involve public in Design, ROW, and Construction as one public involvement effort. Result was higher participation and a more efficient and effective process.

7. Project Report/ Information – Salt Lake City Salt Lake City

SLC is considering redesign for 900 South from Lincoln Street to 1300 East to address growth and development. Round-about option had most favorable public support. Should be open prior to Thanksgiving. Loss of parking was unexpectedly a big issue among residents.

Also, intersection of 300 E 700 S was painted to test redesign with bulb outs and road diet. After testing new "painted" configuration the city can decide whether to make changes permanent.

8. Action Item – Proposed 2020 TAC Schedule Ben Wuthrich

Ben shared a schedule for TAC meetings in 2020. Note that schedule has since been updated to the following:
