Housing is a big issue this year. The legislature has new leadership in 2024. There will be added attention to the 2034 Olympics.

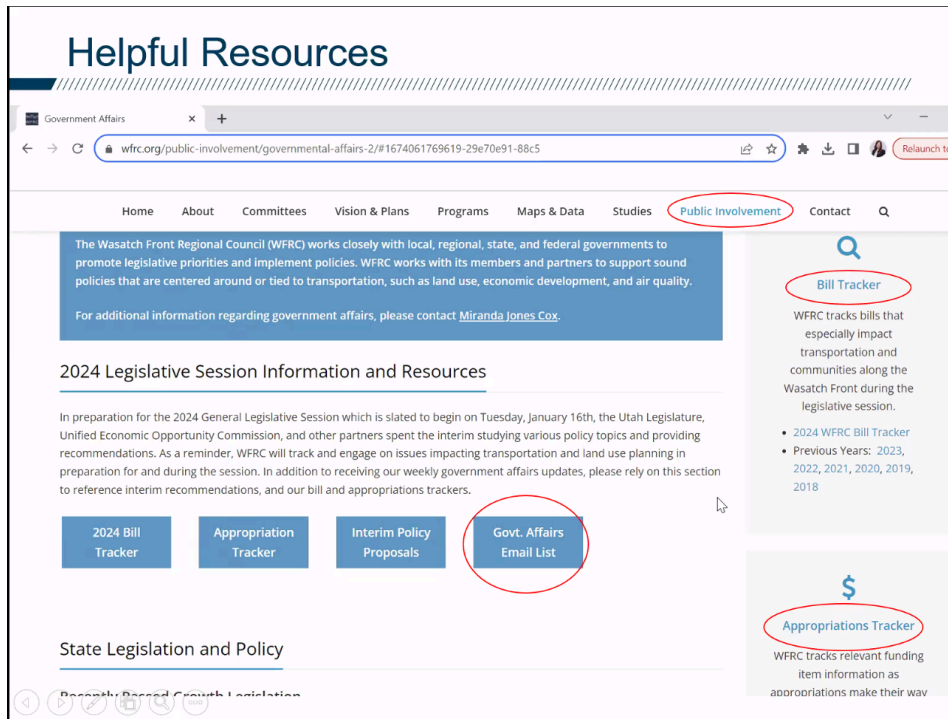

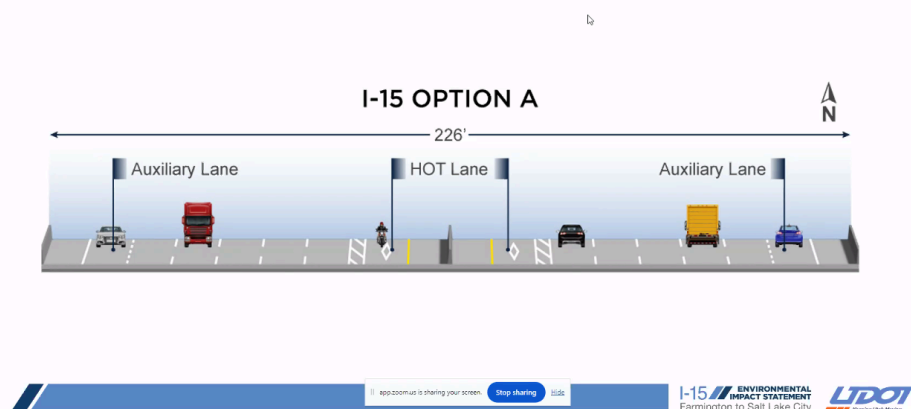

3. I-15 Project Update - Project Team

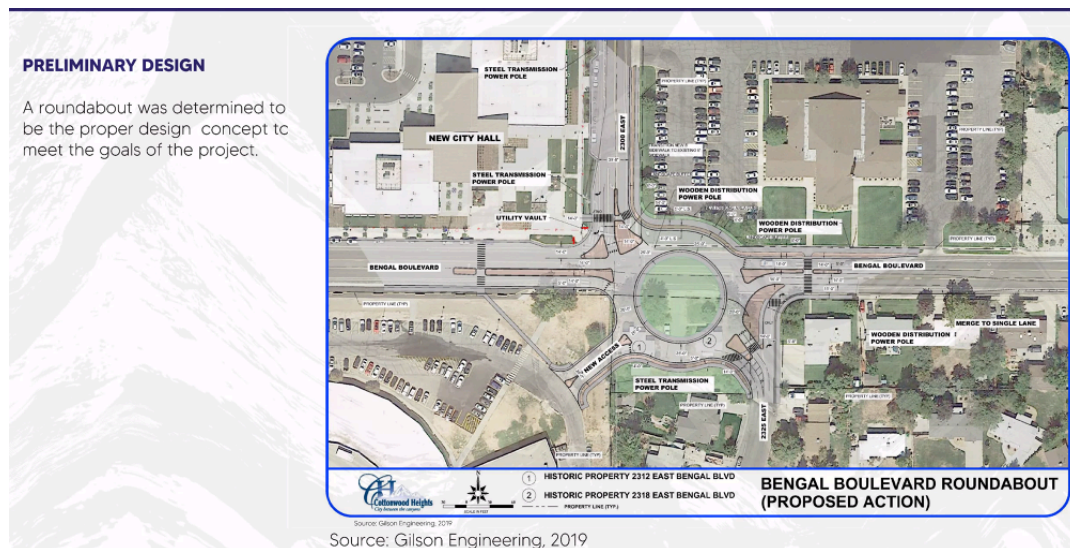
Mike Romero of UDOT reported on progress of the I-15 project EIS from Farmington to SLC. Oldest pavement on I-15 Wasatch Front with deteriorating structures. Travel time will increase from 18 minutes today to 55 minutes in 2050 if improvements are not made. SPUIs and other interchange designs are difficult for pedestrians. Several alternatives for cross sections and interchange configurations were considered. Final EIS should be ready Spring 2024.

5. City Project Report/ Information – Cottonwood Heights

Adam Ginsberg reported on the Bengal Blvd. roundabout project near Brighton HS and City Hall to correct offset intersection situations and pedestrian conflicts with school traffic.

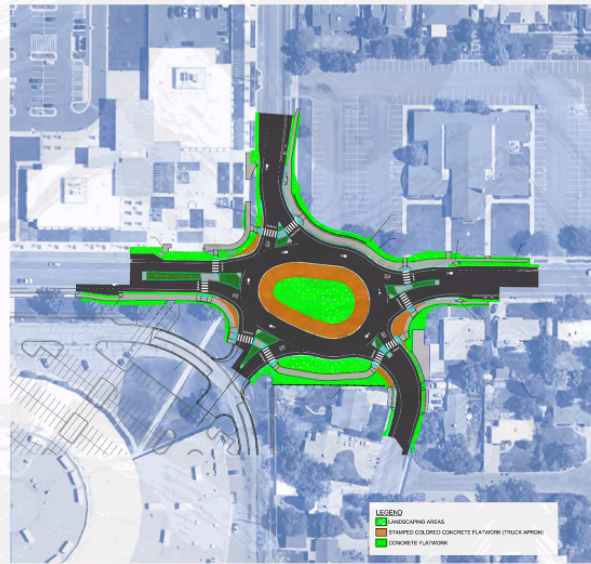


Concerns with ped conflicts with above design.

Redesigned as a crosswalk that allows cars to travel through.

A REFINED REDESIGN

- The oval configuration works best with the offset intersection
- The oval shape slows vehicle speeds through the roundabout
- Reduces the number of pedestrian and vehicle conflict points by three (eliminated bypass right turns southbound to westbound on 2300 E, Bengal Blvd eastbound to southbound 2325 E and northbound to eastbound on 2325 E)
- Improves driver line of site while navigating the roundabout
- Reduces the number of lanes and turning movements
- Improves the turning radius for buses, trucks and Emergency vehicles
- Implements multiple pedestrian crossing enhancements

6. UTA Transit Long Range Plan - Matt Gray

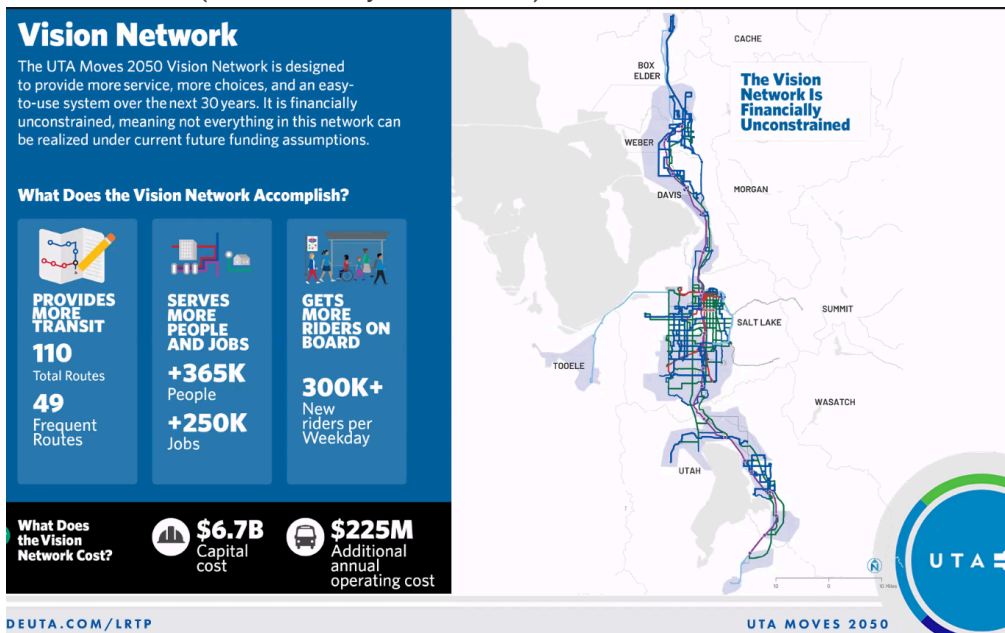
Matt reported on the first long range transit plan considering needs for the next 30 years.

Four Investment Strategies

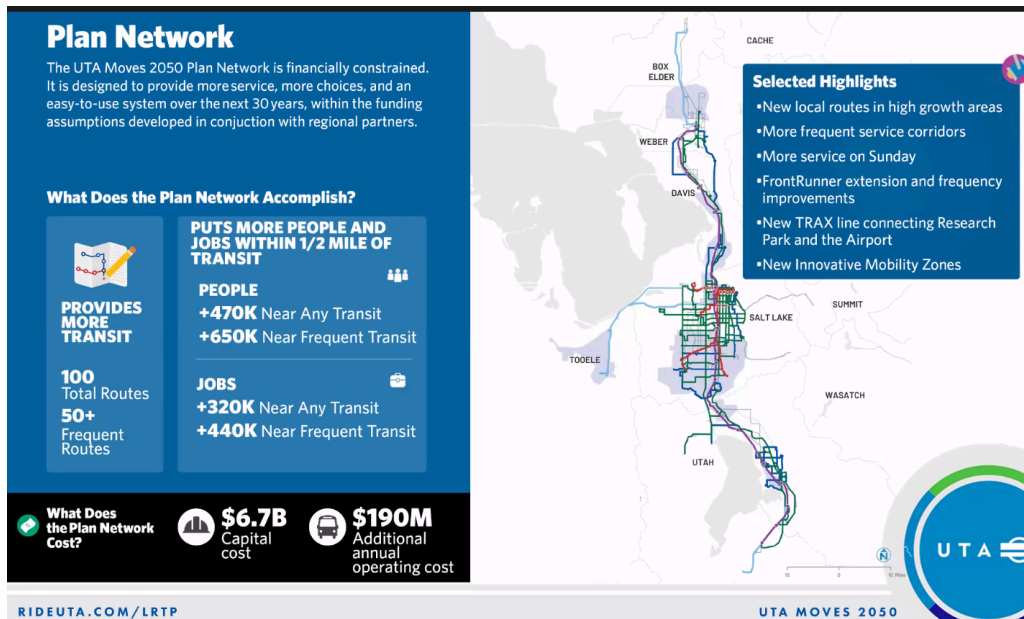


Frequent service means 15 minute headways or better.
