 David and Helen reminded Committee members of the Corridor Preservation

funds that are available. Also noted was HB-488 which allocated some funds to cities. An explanation of the 3rd Quarter sales tax and the funds available for transportation projects followed.


Funds from vehicle registration fees are also available. From the added \$10 registration fee, \$2 is for the County and \$3 for cities. Cities can be reimbursed by the County for ROW acquisition. Cities are encouraged to apply for reimbursement at the time of purchase, but reimbursement is also possible if the County is notified after the purchase.

3. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Business Ben Wuthrich

a. Action: Riverton City modification to the 2024-2029 TIP, PIN 14940, 13400 South bike lanes from 2700 W to 3200 W. The original cost estimate was \$280K in 2016, but due to inflation, an additional \$1.25M is needed, with \$650K from the city and a request for an additional \$600K from STP funds.

b. **Information**: Review Schedule for the 2025-2030 TIP Process Ben reviewed the TIP schedule as shown below. Field reviews, comments, and staff evaluations are completed.

Hugh Van Wagenen presented the staff recommendation for <u>TAP</u> funds which were numbered by project score, highest to lowest.

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#71 - $745,000 - 1300 West Bike Lanes; 4000 South to 3300 South (West Valley)
#66 - $277,288 - Larkspur Drive; 700 East to Carnation Drive (White City)
#62 - $376,267 - 3776 South 2700 Est Crosswalk Enhancement (Millcreek)
#56 - $740,000 - 2700 East Pedestrian Improvements (Holladay)
#43 - $459,810 - BikeShare Capital Care Improvements (Salt Lake)
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There was a motion to accept the staff recommendation for TAP funding with one modification that the limits of the Holladay project on 2700 E be extended without changing the funding amount recommended.

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e. Action: Review and Recommend CMAQ Projects

Kip Billings presented the staff recommendation for <u>CMAQ</u> and <u>CRP</u> funds which were numbered by project rank based on the emission reduction benefit/cost score. The CMAQ and CRP recommendations were presented as a package because a number of projects were seeking funds from both programs.

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#4 - $1.45M - Jordan River Trail Connector; Jordan River to 500 W (So Jordan) #5 - $2.3M - 11400 South 1300 East Intersection (Sandy) #6 - $1.5M - 12300 South; SB 1-15 Offramp to Lone Peak Parkway (UDOT) #7 - $1.0M - Davis-SLC Community Connector; SL to Davis Co (UTA) #8 - $0.762M - Sunnyside Ave Crestview Drive Round-about (Salt Lake)
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Staff recommendation of CRP projects:

#1 - \$1.1M - 11400 South 1300 East Intersection (Sandy)

#2 - \$1.0M - 12300 South; SB 1-15 Offramp to Lone Peak Parkway (UDOT) #3 - \$0.385M - Electric Vehicle Charging Stations at City Complex (Riverton)

There was a motion to modify the staff recommendation to remove the #5 CMAQ and #1 CRP project in Sandy in favor of the #10 CMAQ and #8 CRP project - 11000 South 1000 East Round-about in Sandy at \$2.1M and \$1.1M which was a higher priority for the city and included safety benefits to pedestrians and traffic from Alta High School.
