

### MINUTES of WASATCH FRONT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT March 25, 2019

A meeting of the Wasatch Front Economic Development District (WFEDD) Committee was held on Monday, March 25, 2019 at the Offices of Wasatch Front Regional Council, 41 North Rio Grande Street, Salt Lake City, Utah.

1. <u>Welcome and Introductions [Recording 00:00]</u>. Abby Osborne, Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:35 PM and welcomed everyone. Andrew Gruber, Executive Director for the Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC), also welcomed guests and attendees. Mr. Gruber announced that on Thursday, March 28, WFRC will hold its first full council meeting at 2:00 PM in its new offices; and afterward, an open house and celebration of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of WFRC.

Introductions were then made. At today's meeting, the WFEDD starts its first official committee since last meeting. A closed session was held February 21, 2019 to make committee appointments; and to provide an update for its Comprehensive Economic Development Strategies (CEDS).

Mr. Scott Hess, WFRC, defined that the Wasatch Front Economic Development District (WFEDD) is comprised of board members appointed by the Council of Governments (COG); and a 13-member strategy committee representing private sector and education interests in the five counties making up the WFEDD. Mr. Gruber added there will be additional members appointed to represent Salt Lake County that will attend future meetings. Those in attendance (in alphabetic order) are listed as follows:

# 2. <u>Opportunity for Public Comments [Recording 06:35]</u>. Chair Osborne welcomed public comments. There were none.

3. 2018-2023 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy Work Session [Recording

**07:25].** Scott Hess presented a preliminary draft of four CEDS strategies and objectives (handout), which are: <u>Strategy 1</u>: Link Development with Transportation and Other Infrastructure; <u>Strategy 2</u>: Create Fiscally Sustainable Places; <u>Strategy 3</u>: Provide Amenities; and <u>Strategy 4</u>: Attract and Retain Businesses, and Encourage Innovation. Each CEDS strategy outlines objectives; collaborative actions; and performance evaluation measures. Mr. Hess noted that the CEDS is adopted every five years and updated annually by the committee.

Mr. Hess also presented the four Annual Objectives for 2019 (handout) adopted in January, and stated that completion of the CEDS is part of the first Annual Objective for the committee. WFEDD's first Annual Objective reads: "Complete, adopt, and report on the 2018-2023 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS)."

Mr. Hess stated that today is a work session and information taken from today's discussion will be written into the Final CEDS to be considered for adoption at the May 20, 2019 WFEDD meeting. The adopted CEDS report will then be submitted to the regional Economic Development Administration in Denver by June 1, 2019 (which has already received the draft form to begin review).

Comments and feedback were widely received, with discussion on each of the four strategies.

There was discussion concerning Objective #1, that the partnership is between Salt Lake County, UDOT, UTA, and WFRC. The partners will work to complete, adopt and report on the 2018-2023 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).

Scott will update the four strategies before adoption. The full report of the CEDS document will contain full spellings with no acronyms, and additional descriptions where noted in the discussion. *Note: CEDS will be open for public comment from April 12, 2019 to May 13, 2019.* 

### 4. <u>Round-Table Discussion – WFEDD and Partners</u>

WFEDD members had an opportunity to bring comments and questions to the table. Mr. Gruber clarified that the CEDS is one component of the Wasatch Choice 2050 Vision; and Mr. Hess emphasized that the role of the committee is to assist and collaborate around regional economic efforts. Chair Osborne challenged everyone to review the CEDS Strategies and consider how they can impact and implement plans for local projects in their area. Mr. Hess encouraged partners with local government to review the Strategies; and if items are not on the list (in order to apply for funds with EDA), please email him at <u>shess@wfrc.org</u>. He will send updates to the committee prior to the next meeting.

5. <u>Other Business</u>. Upcoming events were discussed. Attendees are invited to WFRC's Open House on March 28, from 4-6 PM; and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Golden Spoke Bicycle Ride is scheduled for May 11, 2019.
