SUBJECT: Request for Project Evaluation Concept Reports and/or Applications

The Wasatch Front Regional Council (WFRC) requests concept reports and/or applications from those who submitted a letter of intent for the Urban Surface Transportation Program (STP) for fiscal year 2026 (FY26), the Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) Program (FY26), the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) (FY22), and/or the Transportation and Land Use Connection Program (TLC)* (FY20).

Concept reports and/or applications are due to WFRC by Thursday, December 12, 2019

<u>This spreadsheet</u> lists the projects for which WFRC received a letter of intent. Please refer to this spreadsheet to see if your submitted project is eligible and to review initial WFRC staff comments.

By **clicking on the project funding source identified in the spreadsheet**, you can access the appropriate form(s) you will need to submit to apply for assistance. The forms vary by funding program.

Please keep in mind if you have filled out a concept report or application in the past, **the forms have been updated** and you will be required to complete and submit a new concept report or application. If for some reason you cannot download the appropriate form, contact Ben (STP, CMAQ, TAP) or Megan (TLC).

In order for WFRC staff to properly review and evaluate each project, please fully complete the necessary forms according to the instructions and provide the required documentation. Due to the large number of potential projects to be submitted, <u>failure to properly fill out the required forms and submit the requested material by December 12, 2019 may result in removal of the submitted project from evaluation and consideration.</u>

For those who may submit multiple projects to be considered for STP, CMAQ, TAP, and TLC funds, please prioritize your project submittals and consider submitting no more than three or four total projects. This will help streamline the evaluation process and ensure your entity's highest priorities are considered.
