#### **ACCESS TO OPPORTUNITY**

STRATEGY: Coordinate transportation investments and land-use decisions to enhance households' access to jobs and educational opportunities and employers' access to workforce and customers.

STRATEGY: Facilitate opportunities for centered development, infill and redevelopment and maximize the use of existing infrastructure.

3 Collaborate to reduce travel demand.

1a Align planning and programming decisions to maximize existing infrastructure and growth in Wasatch Choice centers and infill areas.

2a Consider and monitor longer-term revenue impacts and cost burden of development and infrastructure decisions.

3a Reduce travel demand and driving distances.
