




Wasatch Choice Day, September 12 at the ULCT Convention

Standing almost 6 feet tall, the poster's map depicts what our area can look like in the year 2050. While no time machine is perfect, this view of our region's future is informed by travel, land use and budgeting models, and extensive input gathered from stakeholders including cities and counties, transportation agencies, businesses, and the public.

Wasatch Front Travel Demand Model (v8.3) Released

In collaboration with our partner agencies at Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG), UDOT, and UTA, WFRC wrapped up work on version 8.3 of the official Wasatch Front Travel Demand Model (TDM).

The TDM is built on the Cube software modeling platform. It is used to inform forecasts of future travel patterns and volumes that help to shape the Regional Transportation Plan, as well as various transportation alternatives analyses and environmental studies.

University of Utah College of Architecture + Planning: A Distinguished Alumni Award Winner, Ted Knowlton!

WFRC's Deputy Director, Ted Knowlton has been selected as a recipient of a University of Utah College of Architecture + Planning Distinguished Alumni award. This award was given to those who demonstrate high achievement, innovation, and leadership in their profession and in their community. Ted was among an elite group of others that were chosen for this award.

Ted is a 1996 graduate of the University of Utah with a BS in Urban Planning (this predates the creation of the College of Architecture + Planning). Over the last 24 years Ted has become a recognized expert and leader in regional planning, and has used his experience and knowledge to contribute to his community and to teach hundreds of University students. He is the epitome of a distinguished alum. After earning a Masters in Urban and Regional Planning from Portland State University, Ted joined Fregonese Associates in Portland, Oregon as a Senior Planner. Next, Ted was the Planning Director at Envision Utah where he was the Project Lead for the Wasatch Choice for 2040 and the Mountain View Corridor "Growth Choices" Vision. Ted is currently the Deputy Director at Wasatch Front Regional Council, overseeing the long range planning, analytics, and community/economic development and sustainability considerations. Ted enjoys sharing his knowledge and expertise with others and is an Adjunct Professor in the College of Architecture + Planning at the University of Utah. He is the two-time president of the American Planning Association Utah Chapter, and the Planning Commission Chair for North Salt Lake City. Ted lives in North Salt Lake with his wife, Laura, and their three children, Jacob, Hailey, and Lindsey. In his free time Ted enjoys skiing, cooking, and listening to jazz and blues.


